ENRICHING THE CURRICULUM...

We are lucky to have such a dedicated staff team, who are willing to run after school clubs for the children. We have many skills and interests as a staff team and we give thanks to all staff who work tirelessly on delivering an exciting curriculum. You recently received a letter highlighting the before and after school clubs we have on offer this half term.

Please be reminded that these forms need to be sent into school on Monday. It takes time to organise children from all year groups into clubs. Registers must be created in order for us to safeguard children and staff need a briefing before clubs begin.

We are proud to offer a selection of sporting, musical and creative clubs to engage a variety of children's interests. Art club was very successful last half term and we look forward to afternoon clubs beginning. These will be Eco-Warriors (any children can join), Colouring club and Chess club.



We have given careful consideration to the problem of

getting changed for PE in school.

The time that has previously been wasted (and taken from the PE lesson) has been a concern as we want to deliver quality PE lessons to our children. Items of clothing are frequently lost and areas around school have been untidy.

The infant lessons have, in the past, been much shorter than required due to the adult support needed when getting changed to and from the PE lesson. This has led Governors and myself to the solution of coming into school dressed in PE kit. We have bought every child a smart 'St.Francis' jogging suit, which is to be worn on PE days over the green shorts and white polo shirt. If it is a hot day, children can remove the jogging suit. We certainly would not want any child to become over heated. KS1 will have PE on a Monday afternoon and KS2 will have PE lessons on a Wednesday afternoon. If your child attends a before or after school club, you can send in home PE clothes for him/her to wear, as they will get changed into their school uniform. PE kit must only be worn on PE days.

The new end of day routine is working well. Please be reminded that KS2 children leave from the front of school entrance and KS1 children will be called from the hall door when we see a parent/ carer on the playground.
