Why do we have a PTFA?

In its time the *PTFA* has raised *thousands/hundreds* of pounds, which has been spent on equipment and resources to enhance our children's education experience and the school's facilities.

Our *PTFA* is about much more than simply fundraising. The *PTFA* exists to provide closer links between home and school and it is an excellent way to bring staff, parents and friends together socially in support of the school, working towards a common goal. It is fun too - just ask any of the Committee members or *PTFA* helpers. Obviously, as in any organisation, we have experienced some challenges but with the continued support of parents and staff, our *PTFA* has always succeeded in its efforts.

All parents and members of the school community are encouraged to get involved, even if they only have a small amount of time available. All families are automatically members of the *enter Association name* when their child joins our school.

Links with local businesses

We have, over time, developed strong links with the local community and are always well supported by both residents and businesses, for which we are very grateful. Many of our local shops and businesses are very generous providing donations for raffle prizes, auction items etc and some have taken part in our Christmas and Spring Social. This has made a huge difference to our fundraising efforts.

pay an annual membership fee which gives us lots of member benefits including comprehensive insurance cover for all *PTFA* run events, support and advice on running the *PTFA* plus fundraising ideas and good practice hints and tips. PTA-UK also provides us with the opportunity to meet and communicate with other PTFAs to discuss and share experiences. How we raise money

How we spend the money we raise

Following a fundraising event, the money is banked straight away. It is at our *PTFA* Committee meetings, that the decisions on how to spend the money are agreed.

At our Annual General Meeting, Miss Sarah Deakin will have a 'wish list' of items that the school would like the *PTFA* to consider funding.

Sometimes, it will be for resources to improve a particular area of the curriculum or school environment. The *PTFA* funds are spent on the 'extras' that are not provided by the school's budget, thus making our children's learning experiences so much more fulfilling and exciting.

We always endeavour to spend our funds in ways that will benefit all our children across all areas of the school and curriculum.

The money we raise is usually spent fairly quickly. That way, you can be sure that in supporting our school, your child/ren will feel the benefit, along with everybody else.

We are currently raising funds towards a new outdoor Amphitheatre which the whole school will benefit from.

How we get information to you

We always endeavour to send out a monthly newsletter and in between we will send out information for forthcoming events. The newsletters include information on previous/future events and important dates. Following a *PTFA* event, we always write to let you know how much was raised in the following newsletter, and if we can at that time, we will inform you what the money will be spent on.

PTFA newsletters are posted on the school notice board which is situated on the outside wall, at the front of school and also on our PTFA page on the school's official website.

We have also, recently set up a Facebook page – St Francis Primary School PTFA, which is updated regularly.

How you can get involved
