<u>Student / Pupil Acceptable Use Policy Agreement – for younger pupils (Foundation / KS1)</u>

This is how we stay safe when we use computers:

- I will ask a teacher or suitable adult if I want to use the computers / tablets
- I will only use activities that a teacher or suitable adult has told or allowed me to use
- I will take care of the computer and other equipment
- I will ask for help from a teacher or suitable adult if I am not sure what to do or if I think I have done something wrong
- I will tell a teacher or suitable adult if I see something that upsets me on the screen
- I know that if I break the rules I might not be allowed to use a computer / tablet

Online Safety Rules for Key Stage 2

- We ask permission before using the internet.
- We only use websites, or undertake searches that our teacher has chosen or guided us to.
- ❖ We tell an adult if we see anything we are uncomfortable with.
- ❖ We immediately close any webpage we are uncomfortable with.
- We only email people an adult has approved.
- We send e-mails that are polite and friendly.
- ❖ We never give out personal information or passwords.
- We never arrange to meet anyone we don't know.
- ❖ We do not open e-mails sent by anyone we don't know.
- We do not use Internet chat rooms.

Acceptable Use Policy Agreement

I understand that I must use school systems in a responsible way, to ensure that there is no risk to my safety or to the safety and security of the systems and other users.

For my own personal safety:

- I understand that school will monitor my use of the systems, devices and digital communications.
- I will keep my username and password safe and secure I will not share it, nor
 will I try to use any other person's username and password. I understand that I
 should not write down or store a password where it is possible that someone
 may steal it.
- I will be aware of "stranger danger", when I am communicating on-line and I will not arrange to meet people in person.
- I will not disclose or share personal information about myself or others when on-line (this could include names, addresses, email addresses, telephone numbers, age, gender, educational details, financial details etc.)
- I will immediately report any unpleasant or inappropriate material or messages or anything that makes me feel uncomfortable when I see it on-line.

I understand that everyone has equal rights to use technology as a resource and:

- I understand that the *school* systems and devices are intended for educational use and that I will not use them for personal or recreational use unless I have permission.
- I will not try (unless I have permission) to make large downloads or uploads that might take up internet capacity and prevent other users from being able to carry out their work.
- I will not use the school devices for on-line gaming, internet shopping, file sharing, or video broadcasting (eg YouTube).

I will act as I expect others to act towards me:

- I will respect others' work and property and will not access, copy, remove or otherwise alter any other user's files, without the owner's knowledge and permission.
- I will be polite and responsible when I communicate with others, I will not use strong, aggressive or inappropriate language and I appreciate that others may have different opinions.
- I will not take or distribute images of anyone without their permission.
- I understand that all ICT and technological uses in school are overseen and directed by a member of staff at all times.
