What are CAFOD clubs?

CAFOD clubs are a great way to join with other Catholic primary schools, and together with CAFOD, become part of the global church network working to build a brighter world.

CAFOD clubs will give primary school pupils the chance to get together, at lunchtime or after school. Through games and mini projects, children will learn about the wider world as well as ways they can reach people who urgently need our help.

Right now, a child is going hungry because crops have failed in his village. A family doesn't have clean, safe water to drink, and a girl is missing school because she's sick from a preventable disease. It doesn't have to be this way. Through CAFOD clubs, children can help to change this, so every person in our world has the chance to flourish.

Because CAFOD is part of a global Church network, together we have the potential to reach those that others can't reach.

Why should our school set up a CAFOD club?

Because it's fun! There are loads of interactive games, activities and projects for children to enjoy which will widen their understanding of the world and help them to develop an excellent range of skills. Children will have their own special CAFOD club prayer, sign and badge.

Importantly, CAFOD clubs will help your pupils to live out their faith and will strongly support the Catholic life of your school.

It is a great way of joining with other Catholic schools. Together with CAFOD, your school will join with the global church network to build a brighter world where every person in our global family has the chance to flourish and reach their potential.

Top tips for setting up your CAFOD club

CAFOD clubs are designed to be flexible and easy to set up. If necessary, you could combine your CAFOD club with an existing club in your school. e.g. chaplaincy team or eco club.



For your CAFOD club, think about:

- 1. When to run the sessions at lunchtime or after school? What day of the week?
- 2. Who to invite Key Stage 1 or 2? A chosen year group?
- 3. What information to send out use the information paragraphs for children and parents to help (see below).
- 4. Where to meet set up a CAFOD club display area to showcase activities and achievements.

Information for children
