ARMISTICE 2018

St Francis' is currently involved in an exciting collaborative educational project called "Armistice" and Preston Guildhall has been booked for November 11th 2018 to mark the centenary for the end of "The Great War." The project will involve over 500 children and adults from the Longridge School's Cluster and will tell the story and remember the key events of the conflict through music, dance, drama, poetry and the visual arts. It will culminate with an act of remembrance. We are also wishing to engage the wider community in this project, as it was a historical event that touched so many families and communities particularly so in the North of England.

Mr Gilmour, Mrs Blair and Miss Deakin are performing alongside the Year 4 children at Preston Guild Hall on Sunday 11th November. Mr Gilmour's class are learning all about WW1 and this exciting collaboration with many schools is a wonderful opportunity for children to learn in a cross- curricular and hands on way. The children are very excited about the performance. Please confirm with Mr Gilmour that you can bring your child in Year 4 to participate in this performance. Tickets are available from the school office. The children have already experienced an outstanding day of learning at Barnacre School alongside the other schools in our Longridge cluster. It is vital that we teach children about History and never forget the sacrifice many men and women endured. Mr Gilmour will be sending home a detailed letter for Year 4 parents very soon.
