Throughout this term pupils will be learning;

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Statistics, data and graphs.
- Capacity and Volume
- Position and Direction
- Measurement (Length/Height)







Science-Living things and their habitats

- Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead and never been alive.
- Learn what a habitat is and identify different varieties e.g. micro-habitats, woodland, pond etc.
- Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals.
- Be able to construct a simple food chain.
- Find and make a habitat for animals that live within our school grounds e.g. bug hotel.

Year 1 Parents: Year 1 pupils have their Phonics Screening test the beginning of June. Phonics Play website is a great resource to practise real and nonsense words in preparation for the test.

Literacy

This term pupils will be looking at minibeast themed stories. Some of the stories we will be reading in class are: Superworm, Harry the poisonous centipede, Twist and Hop, Minibeast Bop!, Bad tempered ladybird and many more. Pupils will develop the following skills:

- Write a recount of a real event
- Create a fact file about a minibeast. Use features such as; Title, Sub-heading, labels, diagrams and lists.
- Applying punctuation learnt so far e.g. capital letters, full stops, commas, question marks and exclamation marks within different text types for example; character description, wanted poster and narrative writing.
- To memorise and recite part of a poem learnt in class to an audience.

Pupils are welcome to bring in and share any minibeast stories from home.
