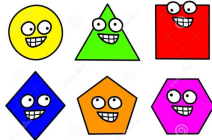
I.C.T.

Mathematics

Throughout this term pupils will be learning;

- Number and Place value
- Measurement (Length & height)
- Addition and subtraction
- Statistics (block graphs/ tally charts)
- 2D and 3D shapes and their properties.



Geography

- Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK.
- Identify and locate hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator (North & South poles)
- Key physical and human features e.g. sea, land, city, town etc.
- Recognise similarities and differences between their own lives and others.
- Be familiar with using a map.



Science

- Learn how plants change throughout the seasons.
- What effects does weather have on physical and human features (food, buildings etc)
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals.
- Group animals based on their different features e.g. wings, scales, fur, feathers etc.
- Name some animals that live in hot and cold countries around the world.

Music

- Represent seasons and weather using a variety of percussion instruments.
- To be able to keep a steady beat and follow a simple melody.

Literacy

This term pupils will be developing their writing skills looking at a variety of authors in particular Julia Donaldson. Pupils will start to use correct letter formation, punctuation and grammar within their writing. Some stories we will be looking at are; Lost and Found, Snail and the Whale, Trolls, Pig up my Nose and many more.

- To re-tell a familiar story in their own words
- To write a sentence using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
- Try to get handwriting consistent in size and on the line.
- To write a weather/seasons themed poem.
- Discuss and identify main events in stories and relate these to their own experiences.
- Year 2 extend sentences using adjectives and try to use cursive writing.
