
Write your own book review about your favourite school story! You can say if you did or did not like it, just make sure you explain why!

Choose your own! What can you think of together?


Literacy




Tricky word hunt! Hide tricky words around the house and go on a hunt! Use the tricky word mats and practice the words you find particularly tricky!
