

Art	Exploring the work of Cezanne and local artist Cassandra Battary. Observational drawing of our local area as well as printing with a range of hard and soft materials. Review what they have done and discuss it with peers.		
Geography	Use basic geographical vocabulary. Use basic fieldwork techniques such as observation and identification. Know that maps give information about places in the world. Identify human and physical features on a map.		
<u>History</u>	Use simple stories to show key understanding of past events. Recognise similarities and differences between past and present. Use a range of sources to answer questions about the past. Observe changes of our school from past to present.		
<u>P.E</u>	Work on fundamental key skills; walking, running, jumping, skipping, balancing, throwing and catching. Also explore gymnastic skills.		
Music	Explore different percussion instruments and be able to follow a		
(Key Composer)	rhythm, pulse and beat. Follow a simple melody taught using our voices. Listen to a variety of composers to develop our musical knowledge.		
R.E	As a class we will be listening to a variety of bible stories and embracing the importance of each story to go forth as followers of Jesus. In class we will be learning about God's Beautiful world, Creation story and the Feast of St. Francis.
