Holidays Out of School Time

A reminder that holidays should not be taken in school time. Penalty notices will be issued for absences of 5 days or more.

Holidays in term time

Where possible, parents should try to avoid taking their child on holiday during term time. There are 175 non-school days each year during which holidays can be taken without impacting on a child's learning. Holidays can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances and must be requested in advance. If you must take your child away during the school term, please discuss this with school beforehand to try to minimise the impact.

Remember, any cost savings should be weighed up against the cost to your child's education.

Attendance

As always, it is school's role to follow procedures and guidance from the DfE, in particular the guidance for schools 'Working together to improve school attendance'. Every school has an attendance officer, through the local authority, who visits school every half term to analyse attendance of children below 94% in school.

Please rest assured, we always aim for a supportive approach to support your child and your family and we understand that there are a variety of illnesses and viruses that have swept throughout schools since September. Genuine illness reasons for a lower attendance are always taken into consideration and we empathise at every level.

The DfE states that pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. As a school we set our own annual target for attendance based on national averages as our guide. Our target for this year is 96%. In order for us to meet this target we need to ask that all pupils aim for at least this level of attendance. Good attendance at school is vital because even short periods of absence can mean that a child's ability to keep up with school work may be significantly reduced. If your attendance is below 92% (national average) you will receive a letter alerting you to the attendance and what procedure will follow to support improving your child's attendance.



DID YOU KNOW.....

•One week missed from school is the same as missing around 25 hours of learning which can't be repeated.



- •90% attendance may sound OK but it is the same as missing a month off school each year. Over the course of a school career, this would add up to a whole year missed! Your child would also be classed as a Persistent Absentee.
- Missed Education = Missed Opportunities

Absences

A reminder that you call the school office in the morning if your child is off sick, please do not send messages on Seesaw to the class teacher. Teaching staff are busy setting up the classroom and do not always have the time to check Seesaw messages in a morning.

Air Up Bottles

After some consideration, we have decided that the "Air Up" water bottles and similar are not suitable for school. Children are sharing bottles so they can try each other's flavours – this can pass on germs and be unhygienic. We have had the heartbreak of smashed, lost and broken bottles. The value of them has caused some "showing off" and with that "envy" which are not the values we wish to promote. Simple water bottles from now on only please.
