Uniform

School Meals

Just to remind families of a price increase for school meals from September, the price will slightly increase to **£2.70 per meal**. School meals will remain free for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and families eligible for free school meals. Payments are to be made via Parent Pay, we kindly ask that all Parent Pay accounts are kept in credit.

Car Park

Please park courteously (not on corners or a take up more space than is required). We have more cars coming in and out of school this year, so it is more important than ever to park with care and consideration and be prompt when picking up/dropping off your children to allow spaces to be freed up quicker. Please also be reminded that the carpark next to the playground is the infant car park, and the carpark on the driveway is for junior children. Thank you for your support and cooperation.

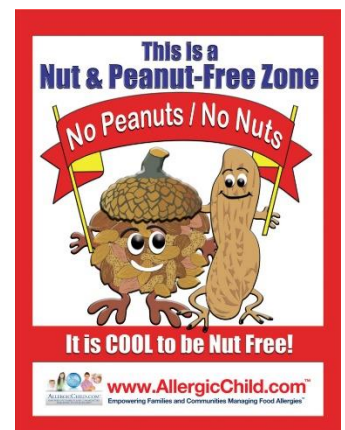
